Ukedo Elementary School in Namie Town was greatly damaged by the tsunami following the Great East Japan Earthquake, but fortunately all the students who attended the school at the time were evacuated to safety. 3 Unique Local Ceramic Ware

Obori Soma Ware has a history of more than 300 years, and was once praised by the shogun Tokugawa lemitsu (1604-1651). Its unique cracked glaze and double-fired technique has been preserved by a handful of potters over the years, and it was designated as a traditional work of art in 1978.





View the Sake Brewing Process

At the Namie Michi-no-eki Road Stop, visitors can view the sake brewing process at the Suzuki Brewery. They can also purchase sake, sake meal, and Japanese sake-based additives. Tasting is also available, as are a selection of lunch and desserts at YUI, a café directly operated by the brewery.
