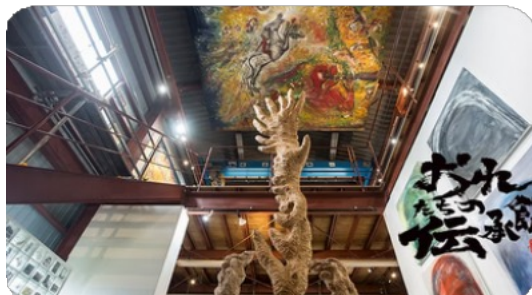


Fukushima Hamadori Coastal Area Model Itinerary 5

SPOT 1 Artistic Collaborative Museum

Through the exhibits of artworks, the Oretachi no Denshokan (Our Heritage Museum) hopes to provide an opportunity for visitors to view the lessons of the Fukushima nuclear disaster as their own issues, and to re-examine and pass on this important part of history to future generations.

SPOT 2 A Co-working Space with Café and Bakery

Aosubashi serves delicious light meals at its co-working space facility. The Café on the first floor features a wide selection of specialty breads from all over Japan and serves the finest coffee made by leading baristas. The restaurant menu changes monthly, featuring a variety of cuisines.



SPOT 3 Local Souvenirs and Craft Sake

The haccoba Odaka Station Brewery and Public Market is located at Odaka Station, an unmanned JR station. It sells a wide variety of products, including local souvenirs and original products. haccoba's sake brewery has a unique fermentation philosophy that goes beyond tradition.



SPOT 4 A Showcase for Local Craftsmanship

KIRA is a specialty store that illustrates the power of local culture and craftsmanship. The store displays and sells items that reflect traditional craftsmanship, such as watches produced in Fukushima Prefecture, Aizu Hongo-yaki pottery, Aizu lacquerware, and Obori Soma-yaki pottery.
